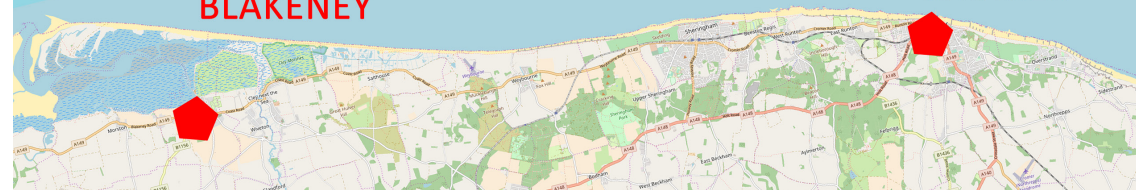

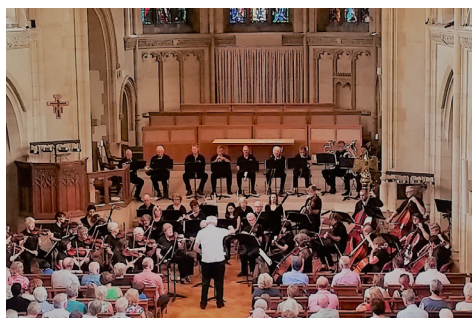

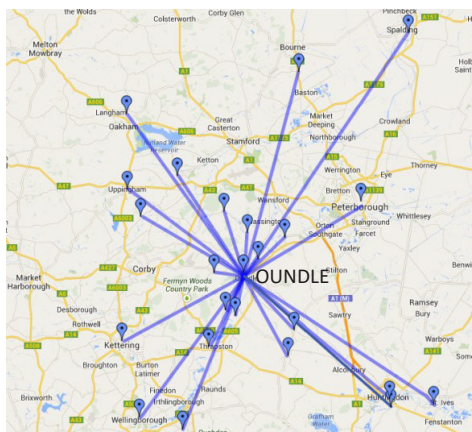

RPO members come from far and wide!

The orchestra was originally formed following a visit to Oundle by the celebrated author Alexander McCall-Smith, who founded our Scottish cousin, "The Really Terrible Orchestra", based in Edinburgh.

The Rusty Players was founded by Oundle resident, and abandoned clarinet player, Chris Gill, and it has grown steadily to its present size with all departments filled.

The orchestra itself has no auditions: if you have an instrument, an open mind and a music stand then you are in. We work our way through a vast selection of music from Brahms to Bernstein.

Our members range from young 20 somethings to over 80 – some are retired, others use the orchestra as an escape from the rigours of professional lives, and a few as time-out from looking after children! Once a fortnight the daily routine is suspended while we indulge in an hour and a half of music making.

We give regular concerts in halls and churches in the area, including a regular spot at the Oundle International Festival. In May 2016 we undertook an ambitious tour of the Loire Valley in France!

The Rusty Strings have a separate repertoire, and regularly perform in the Oundle Festival Fringe.
